

Softball WA – What We Provide

As part of their Individual Registration Fee, players and officials contribute to the overall administration costs of Softball WA and Softball Australia. Softball WA also relies on other revenue sources such as grants, sponsorships and income from programs or events to operate and deliver services to members. Below provides a summary of the services and benefits of affiliation with Softball WA. It's important to note that individual registration fees overall contribute to services provided to clubs and associations that support and build capacity of volunteers who manage organised competitions. - Personal injury insurance for players, coaches, officials and volunteers.
- Access to off-season programs, clinics and pathway opportunities that support player and coach development.
- Access to training and development to progress along the National Accreditation Scheme pathway for coaching, scoring and umpiring.
- Access to tournament and championships facilitated by Softball WA and other member states (e.g. Junior State Championships).
- Players, coaches and officials are afforded opportunity to be selected in state or national teams, or participation in various competitions nationally or internationally.
- Access to a National Member Benefits program that provides discounts on groceries, fuel, online shopping, cinema tickets, travel, accommodation and much more.
- Contribute to the development of softball in the community in Western Australia.

- Access to a free website to promote your club/association
- Access to a free online competitions system to create fixtures, ladders and collate key competition information
- Access to grant programs, such as the Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund and Active Regional Community Grants.
- Free resources and access to programs to increase participation such as Sporting Schools, Social 7's and Softball Batter-up.
